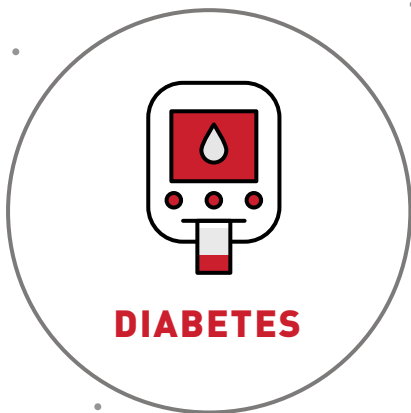
CANCER

HEART DISEASE

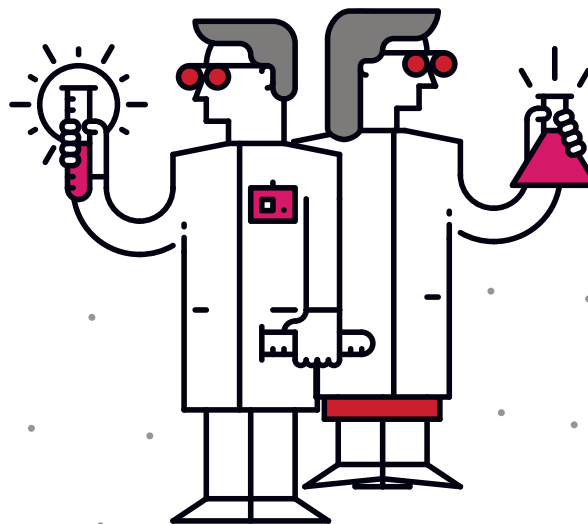
- The Baker Institute is conducting a study on the prevention of Coronary Artery Disease in people who have a family history of this illness by using coronary scanning to reduce the risk of heart attack.



DIABETES

89 islet transplants have been done into 44 Type 1 Diabetes patients with severe hypoglycaemia, some of whom have had more than one transplant. 19 patients have subsequently become insulin-independent thanks to this research underway at St Vincent's Institute.
